



STRUCTURED CAMPAIGN TO REDUCE COMMUTER CAR PARKING – CALLING ALL CAR OWNERS TO PARTICIPATE!

Many individual car owners park outside their homes or on adjacent green spaces early in the morning to save a parking space for their own and visitor use during the day which works to an extent on a small scale. The key times for commuter parking are from around 7am to 10 am each morning.

The Committee believes that a more structured and timed effort would bring much greater results as commuters that cannot find a place to park in the estate over a number of consecutive days will move elsewhere. With this in mind we have selected the following dates, which cover holiday and back to school times, for a more targeted campaign by everyone:

26th – 31st July
19th – 26th August
9th – 16th September

During those dates it would be great if as many car owners as possible can park outside their homes overnight (or from 7 am) and leave them there until after 10 or 11 am. The key areas to target are:

Outside the houses
At the entrance to the estate
Along the two sides of the green nearest the houses

You need to discuss this approach with your neighbours so that you can work out locally what works best e.g. do not take a space outside someone else's home that is being used by them and perhaps a person who does not have to leave for work can park outside someone's home once they leave for work by agreement with that neighbour.

If there are extra cars available between 7am and 11am then people may wish to park them along the slip road to Sliver Park but this is not a priority area.
